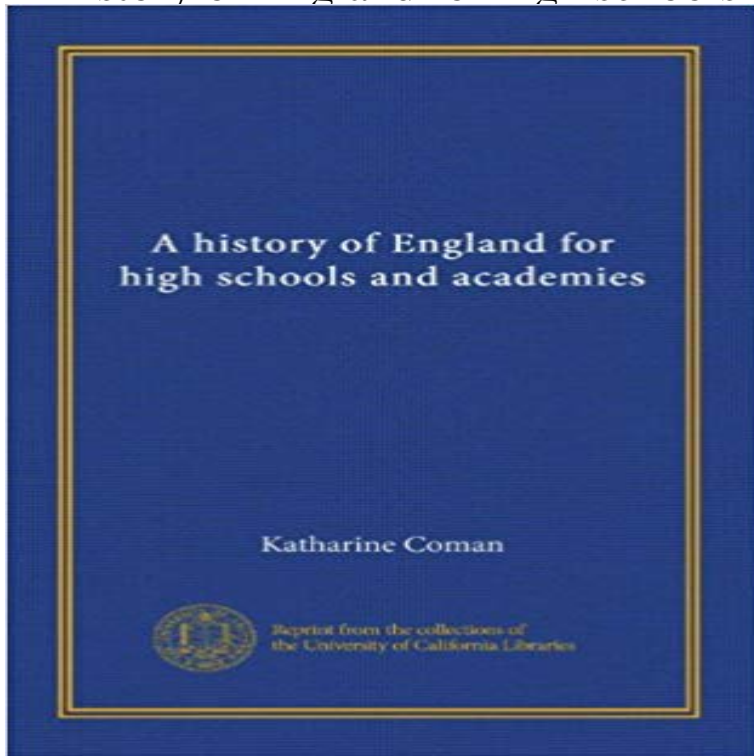


A history of England for high schools and academies
