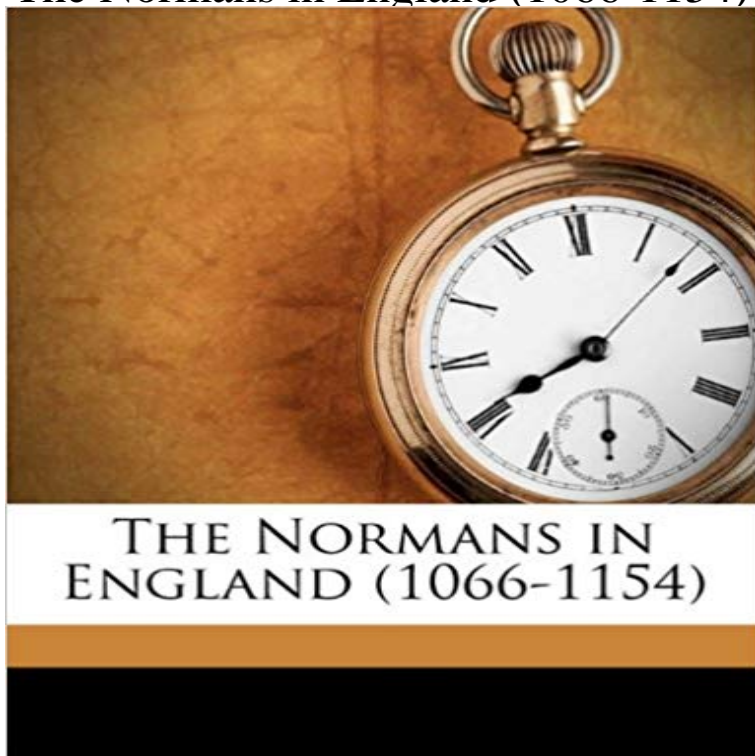


The Normans in England (1066-1154)
