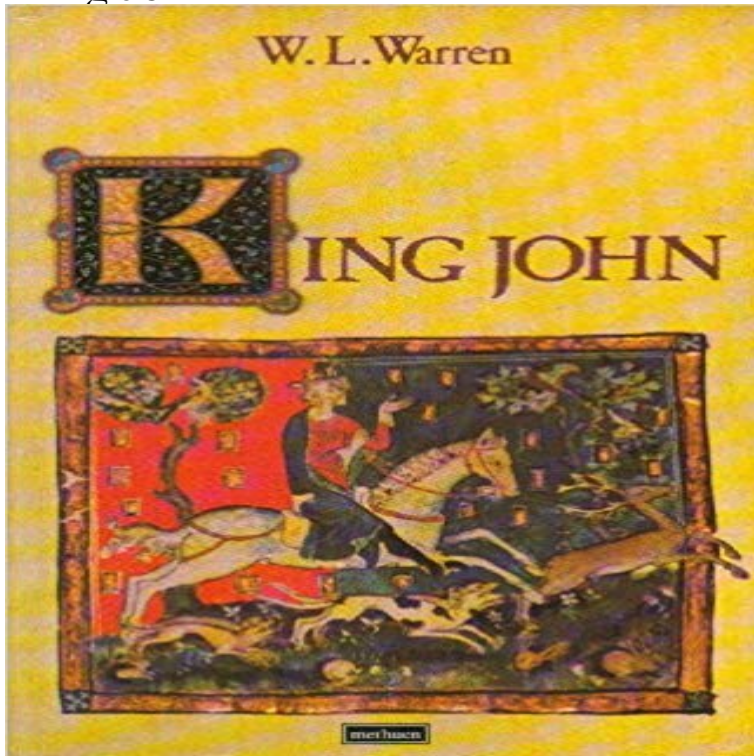


King John
