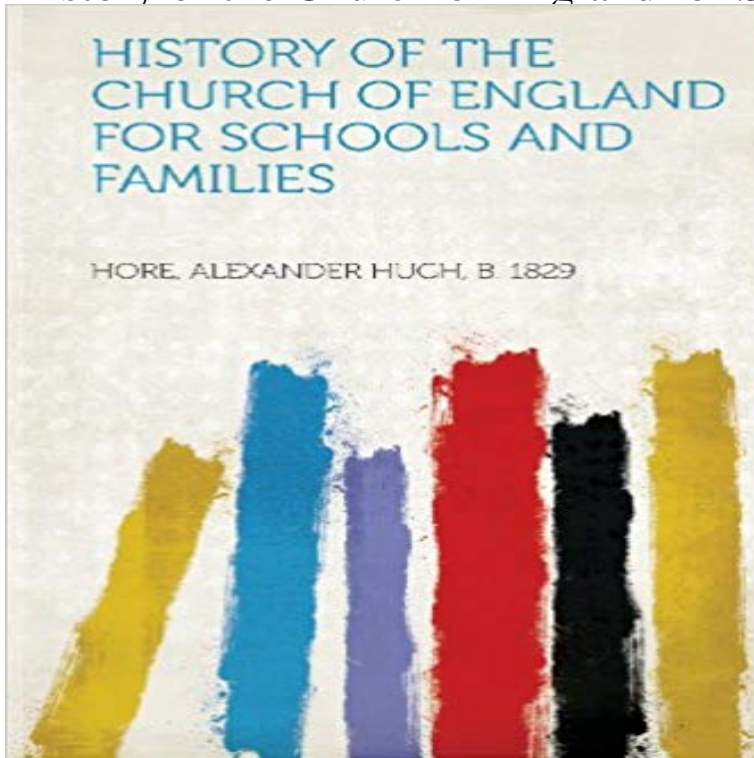


History of the Church of England for Schools and Families
