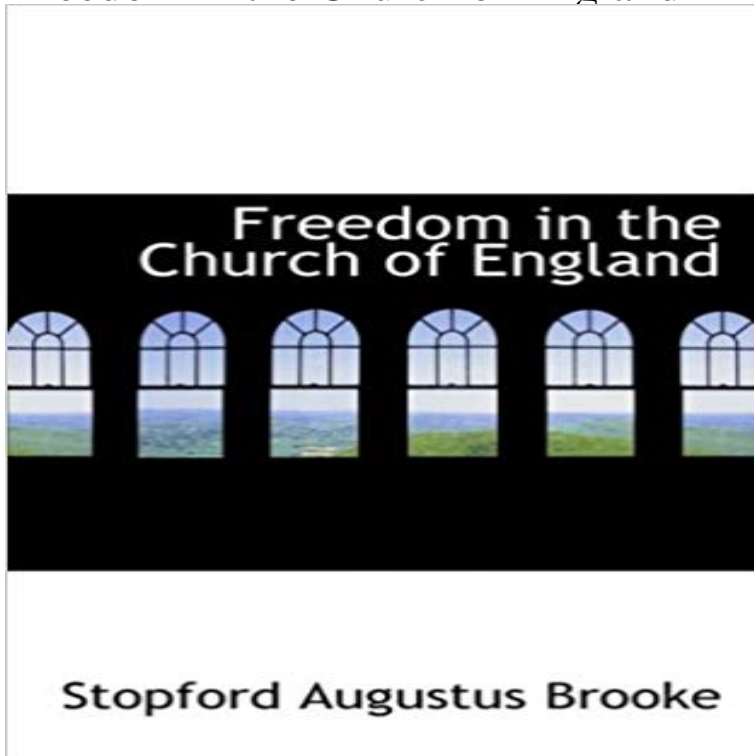


Freedom in the Church of England
