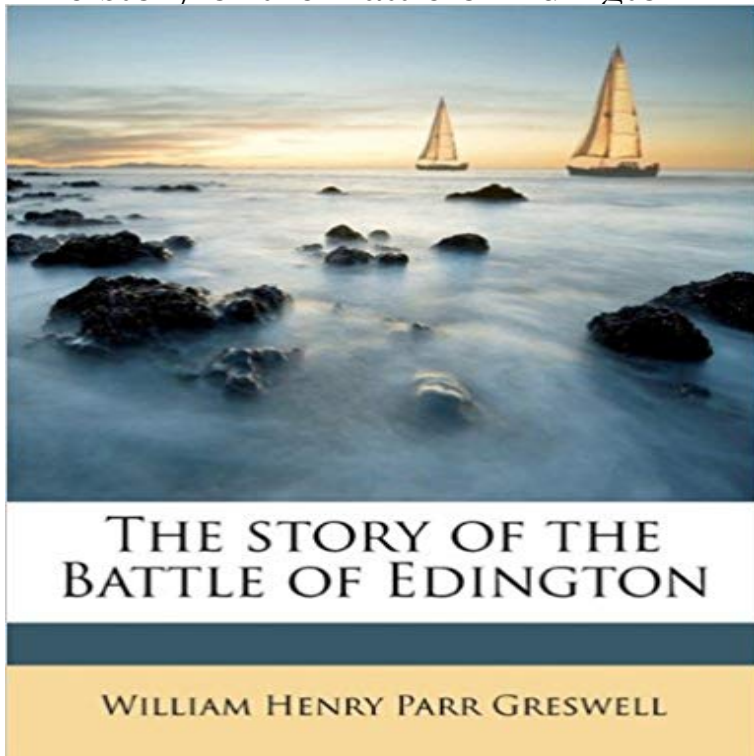


## The story of the Battle of Edington
