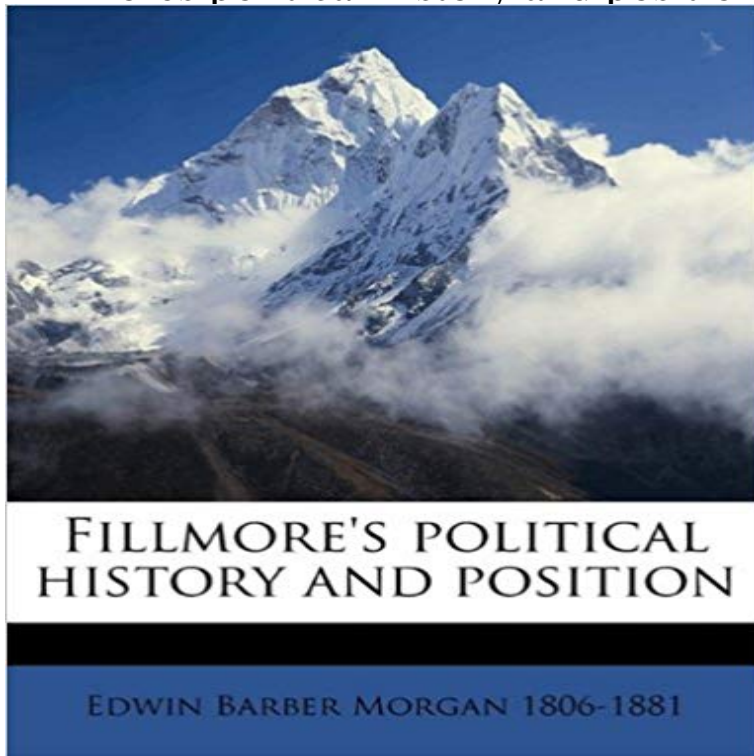


Fillmores political history and position
