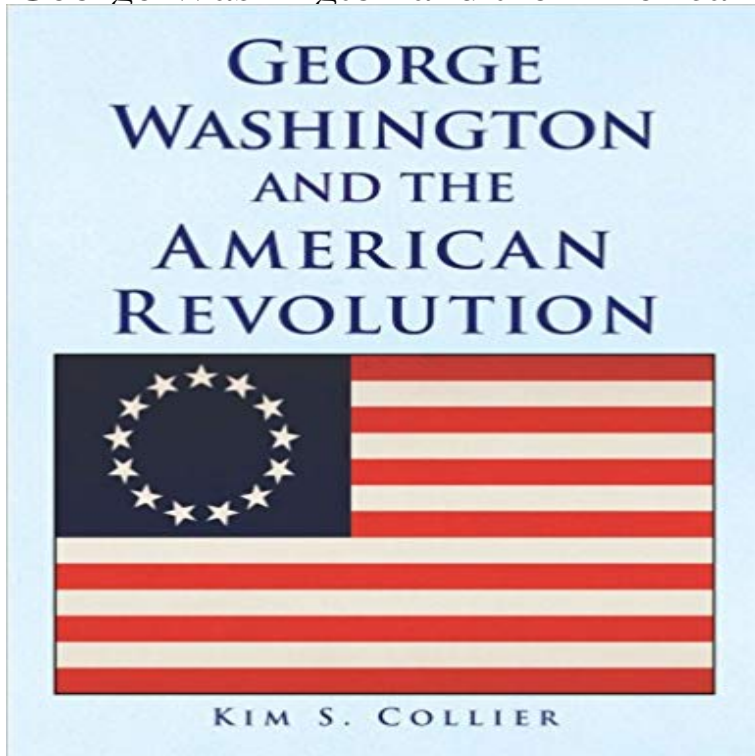


George Washington and the American Revolution
