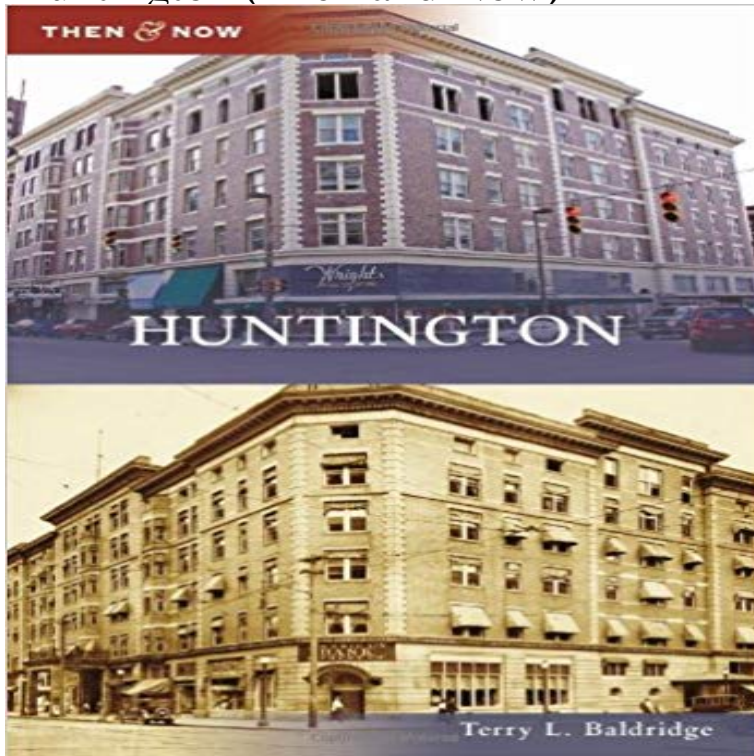


Huntington (Then and Now)
