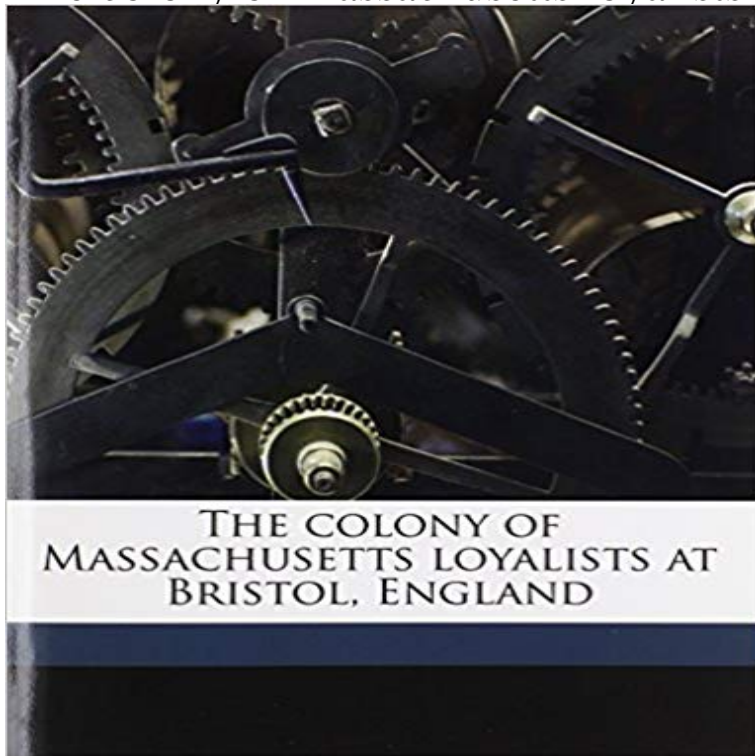


The colony of Massachusetts loyalists at Bristol, England
