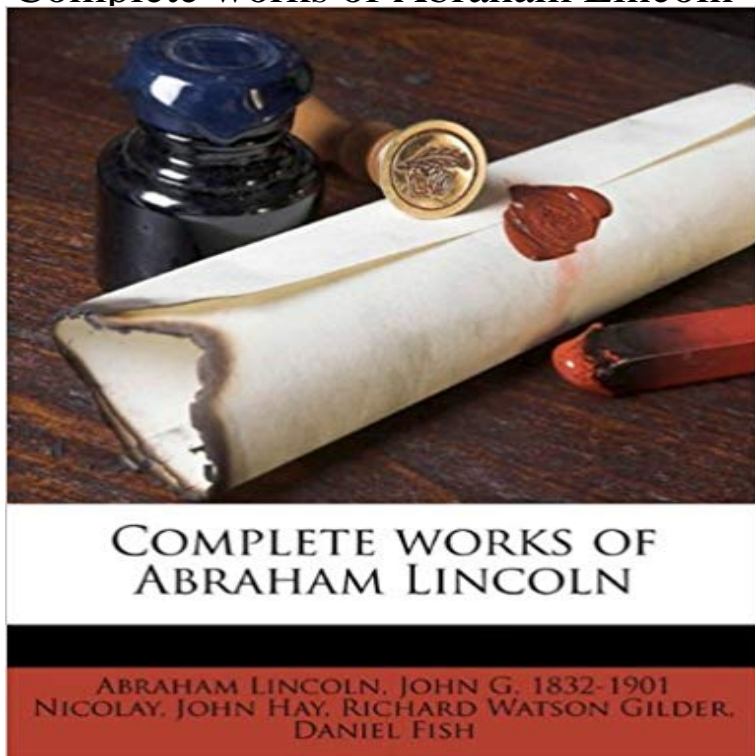


## Complete works of Abraham Lincoln Volume 4
