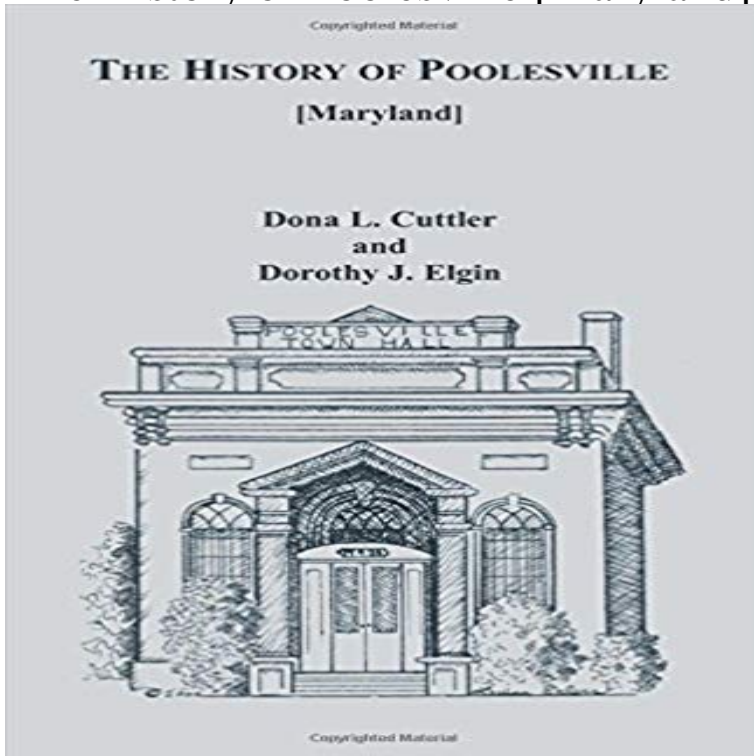


# The History of Poolesville [Maryland]
