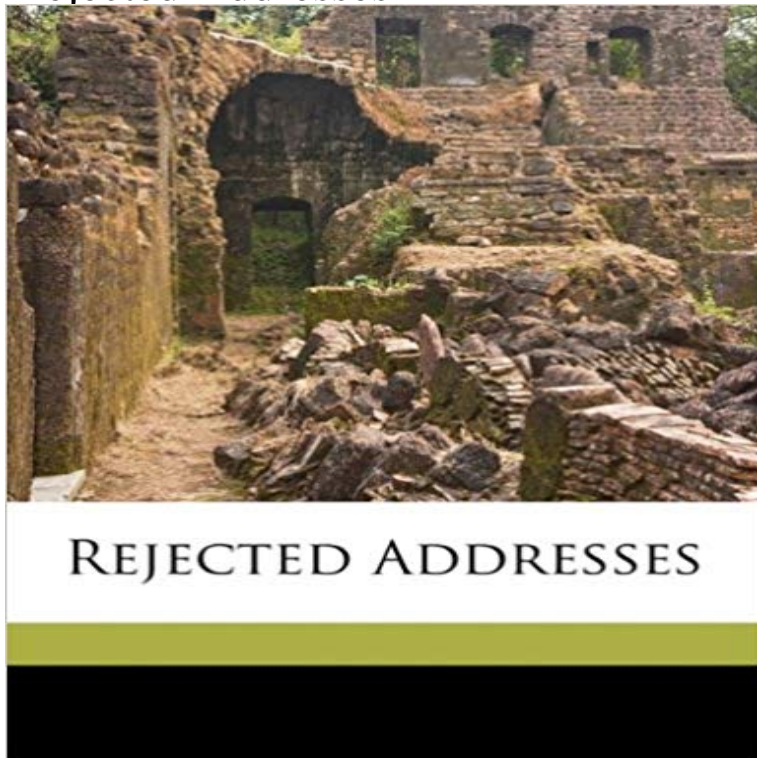


Rejected Addresses
