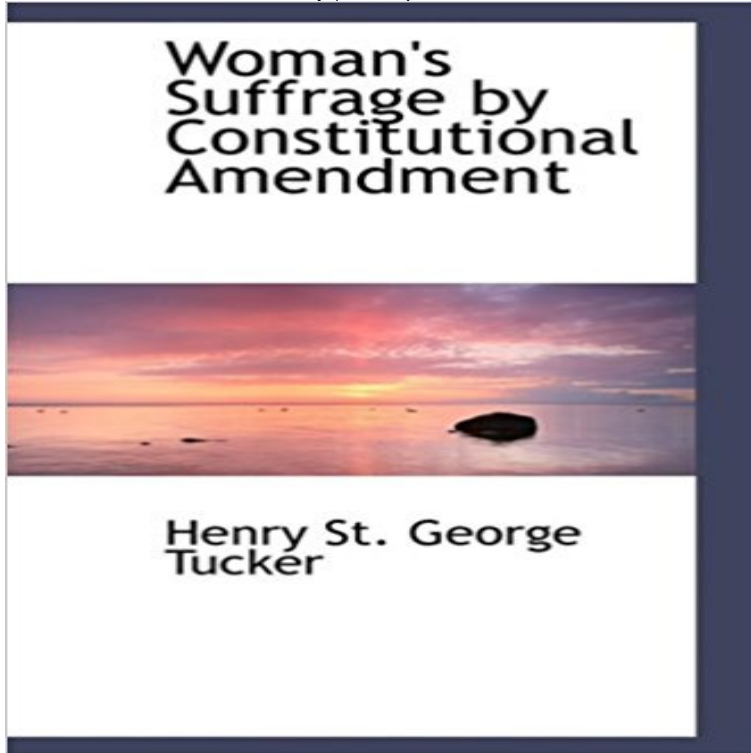


Womans Suffrage by Constitutional Amendment
