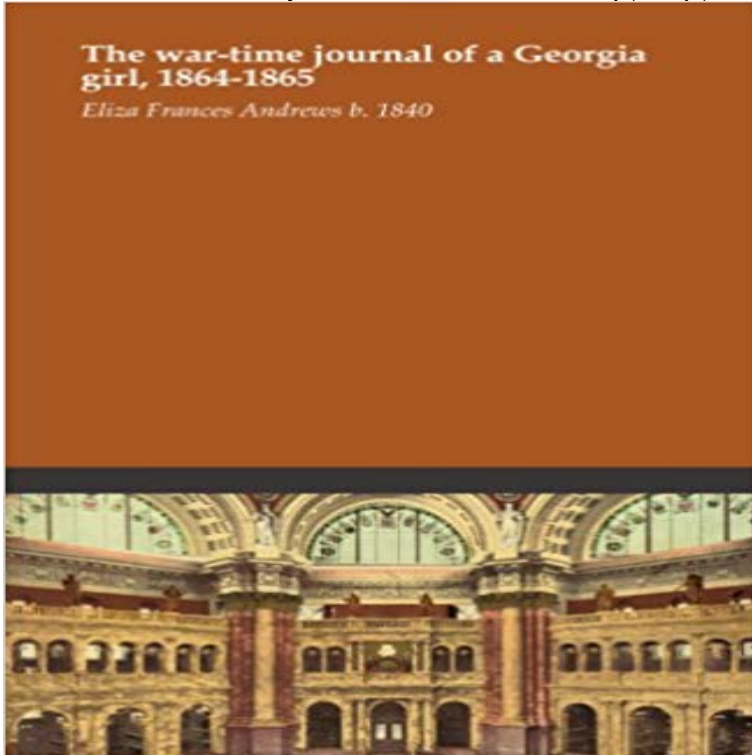


## The war-time journal of a Georgia girl, 1864-1865
