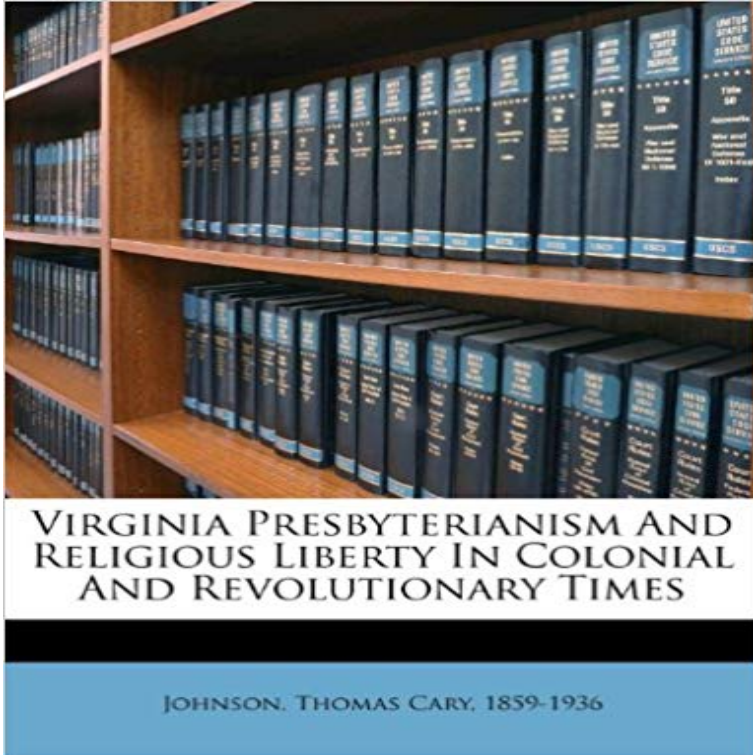


# Virginia Presbyterianism And Religious Liberty In Colonial And Revolutionary Times
