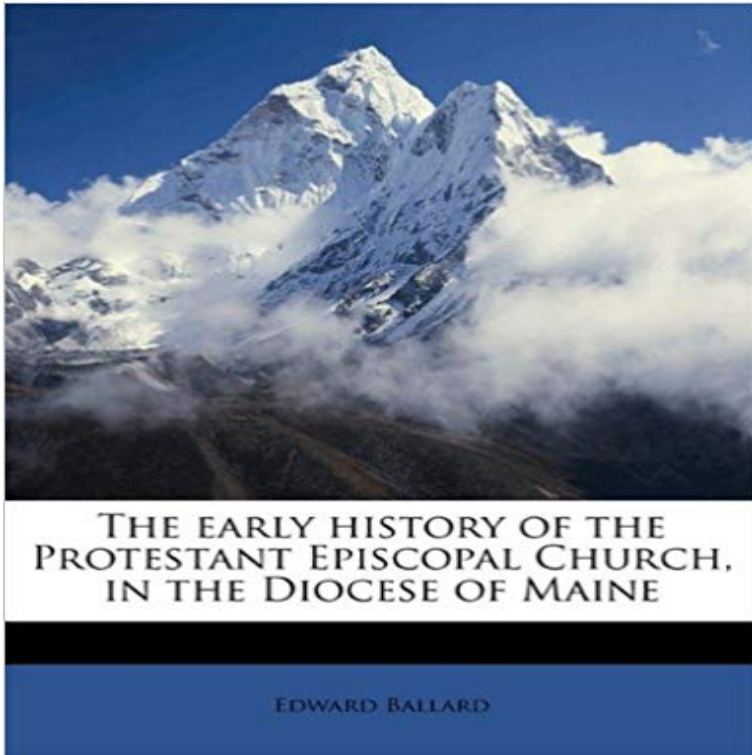


The early history of the Protestant Episcopal Church, in the Diocese of Maine
